





Building 10 is filled with history. Also called the Craddock Terry building, the second half of the building was the Craddock Terry shoe factory. Rumor has it that this part of the building was constructed from brick taken from pilings of High Bridge, a key point of interest during the Civil War. The first half of the building was a tobacco warehouse like its neighbors.
